Disability Representative Organisations Program 2024-26: Successful Applicants

The Disability Representative Organisations (DRO) program has committed \$10,658,000 (GST exclusive) to 11 organisations to deliver systemic advocacy for two years (2024-2025 and 2025-2026).

Funded organisations will operate on a national level to represent the voices of people with disability across Australia.

To support the DRO program, Disability Advocacy Network Australia (DANA) will continue as the provider of the National Coordination Function. DANA will receive \$700,000 (GST exclusive) over two years (2024-2025 and 2025-2026) to deliver this key function.

DANA will now be funded in their own right as a peak for the individual advocacy sector. In this capacity, DANA will continue to be recognised as a DRO to deliver systemic advocacy through representing people who engage with individual disability advocacy supports.
